



Chandrayaan-2-A mission that made India proud.

Chandrayaan-2 is the second lunar mission of India after the success of Chandrayaan-1. This mission was conducted for topographical researches and mineralogical studies to have a better understanding of the Moon's origin and evolution. Chandrayaan-2 Mission was launched from the Satish Dhawan Space on July 22,2019, by GSLV rocket. The main aim of Chandrayaan-2 was to trace the location and abundance of lunar water on the moon's surface.

"Chandrayaan-2 fostered the findings of Chandrayaan-1 as reported by the ISRO. The mission targeted the "South Polar Region" of the Moon which was completely unexplored. The mission focused on the extensive mapping of the lunar surface for studying variations in its composition and tracing the Moon's origin and evolution. Chandrayaan-2 was considered as a challenging mission as the South Polar Region of the Moon was totally unexplored by any space agency before.

In all the space missions, no country has ever attempted to land a spacecraft in the polar regions of the moon. This gave India a lead in space exploration on an international level. The lander of Chandrayaan-2 is named Vikram after Dr Vikram A Sarabhai, the father of the Indian space programme. It is designed to function for one lunar day, which is equivalent to about 14 Earth days. Vikram has the capability to communicate with the orbiter and is designed to execute a soft landing on the lunar suface on 7th September.
